What is an Evidence-based Program?

A researched program with experimental studies that employ the following:

- At least two randomized control group trials (RCT)
- At least one RCT independent replication
- Outcome shows change in research-based risk factors
- Studies use reliable measures including reports, observations, assessments
- At least one-year follow-up







Incredible Years ® (IY) is an Evidence-Based Program

- Over 35 years of research: starting with parent programs, then child programs, and then teacher programs
- **Parent programs**: 9 RCT treatment trials & 4 RCT prevention trials by developer and 14+ independent RCTs from 5+ countries (including England, Holland, Norway, Portugal, Spain, Wales).
- **Child programs**: 3 RCT treatment trials & 2 prevention trials by developer and 3+ independent RCTS from 3 countries (including Norway, Wales, Spain, US)
- **Teacher programs**: 3 RCT trials by developer and 7+ independent RCTs from 4 countries (including Ireland, Norway, US)

Short Term Goals

- Improve parent-teacher-child relationships
- Reduce harsh discipline at home and school
- Increase parent and teacher social support & reduce stress
- Improve home-school communication
- Promote child social competence, emotional regulation, problem solving and school readiness
- Prevent, reduce, and treat social and emotional problems in young children

Long Term Goals

 Prevent conduct disorders, school drop out, delinquency and substance abuse

Incredible Years IY Parenting Program Group Methods & Process – Fidelity Delivery

- Developmentally based
- Culturally sensitive addresses parent long term goals
- Emphasizes the therapeutic relationship: "Collaborative Process"
- Principles training ~ e.g., attention principle
- Coping (vs. Mastery model) self-reflective, experiential and problem-solving based learning
- Video modelling/DVDs
- Role play practice & rehearsal
- Focus on cognitive, affective, & behavioral changes & promoting attachment.
- Weekly goal setting & self-monitoring
- Weekly home activities
- Group support
- Sensitive to socioeconomic barriers



Incredible Years Parent Learning Principles

Behavioral Skills: Play, coaching, praise, nurturing, effective communication, incentives, routines, limit setting, proactive discipline, problem-solving

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Cognitions: Reducing negative thoughts and attributions about self, children & others; selective attending to positive experiences, increasing positive coping thoughts, developing normal child developmental expectations for behavior, temperament differences, and perspectives, self-reflection, problem solving


Affect: Coping with emotions, feeling competent, gaining support from family, teachers and friends, anger and depression management, developing self-care & forgiveness strategies, planning pleasurable activities





Incredible Years[®] Parenting Pyramid[®] Model

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Promoting Parent Engagement

- Interviews prior to group
- 10-14 parents per group
- Partners encouraged, multi-level families
- Day and evening groups
- Meet weekly for 2 hours
- Two trained leaders
- Buddy calls & activities
- Weekly group leader calls
- Food, Transportation
- Child Care





credible **IY Parent Programs Outcomes**

Results from randomized controlled research trials by program developer and independent researchers:

- Increases in positive, responsive parenting
- Decreases in harsh discipline

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- Reductions in parental depression & stress
- Increased parental self-confidence/self-efficacy
- Reductions in child conduct problems
- Increases in child social competence & school readines





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8-12 Year Follow-up of Treated Children with ODD

Findings: (children ages 13-19)


- 16% (mothers) & 12% (fathers) reported
- CBCL externalizing scores in clinical range
- 77% no major delinquent acts
- 54% no substance use
- 18.2% mothers reported child involvement in criminal justice system
- Findings similar to "typical" normative data for age
